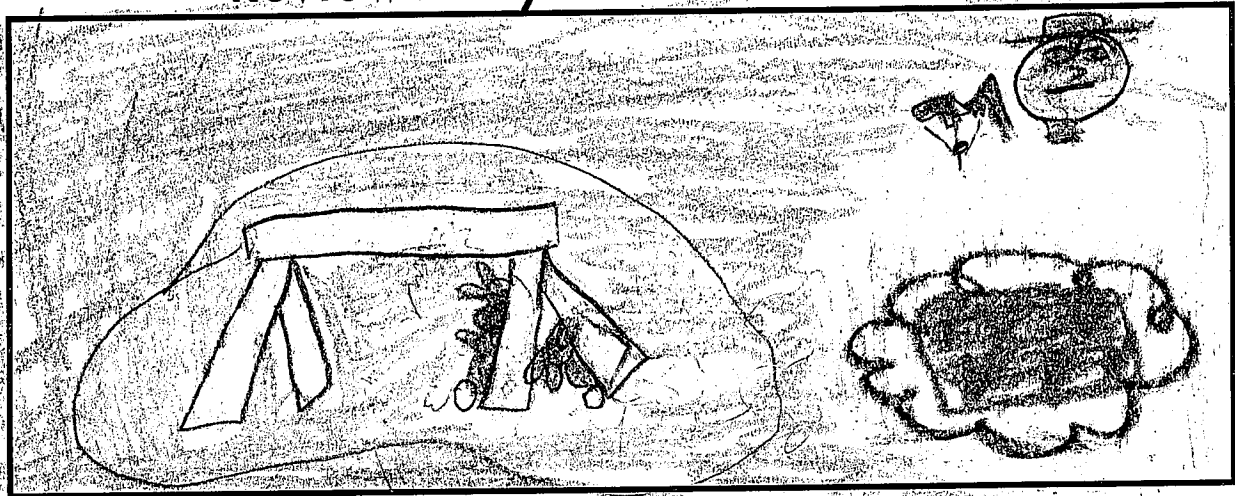


Muncha! Muncha! Muncha!

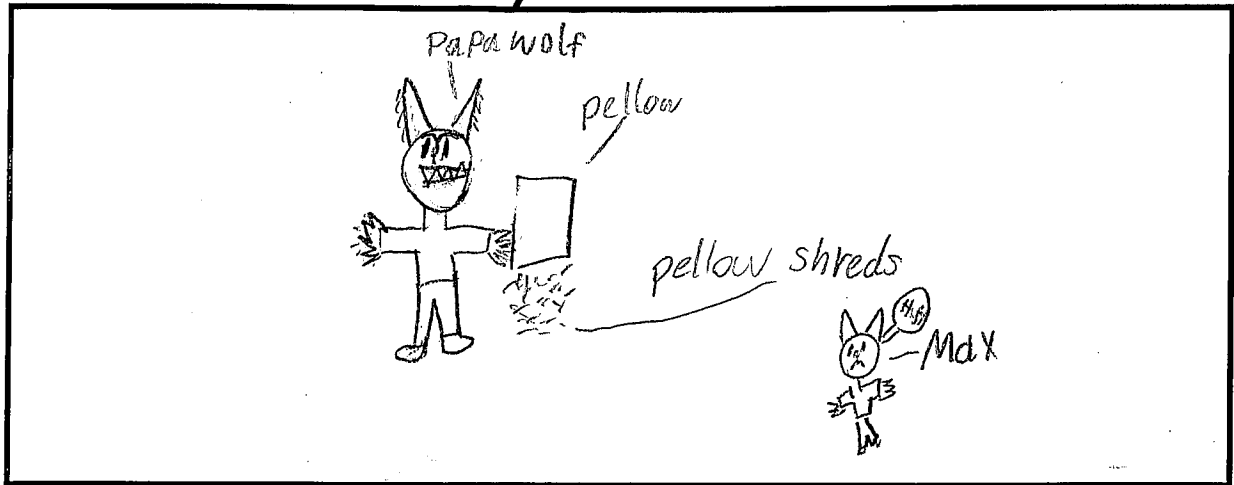
My favorite part is when the three little bunnies go Muncha! Muncha! Muncha! I think it's funny.

The author's message is that you can be anything you want to be.

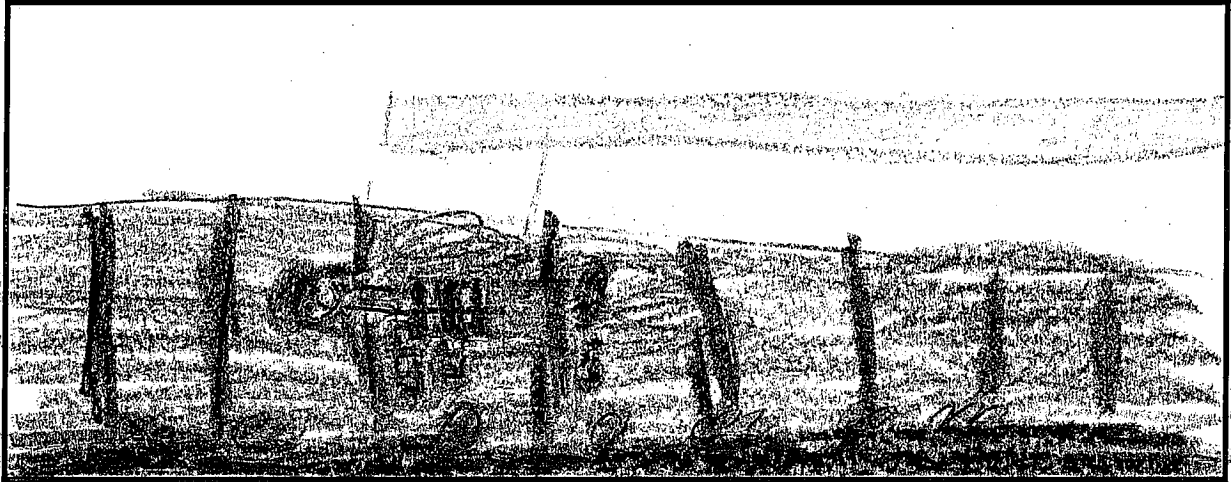

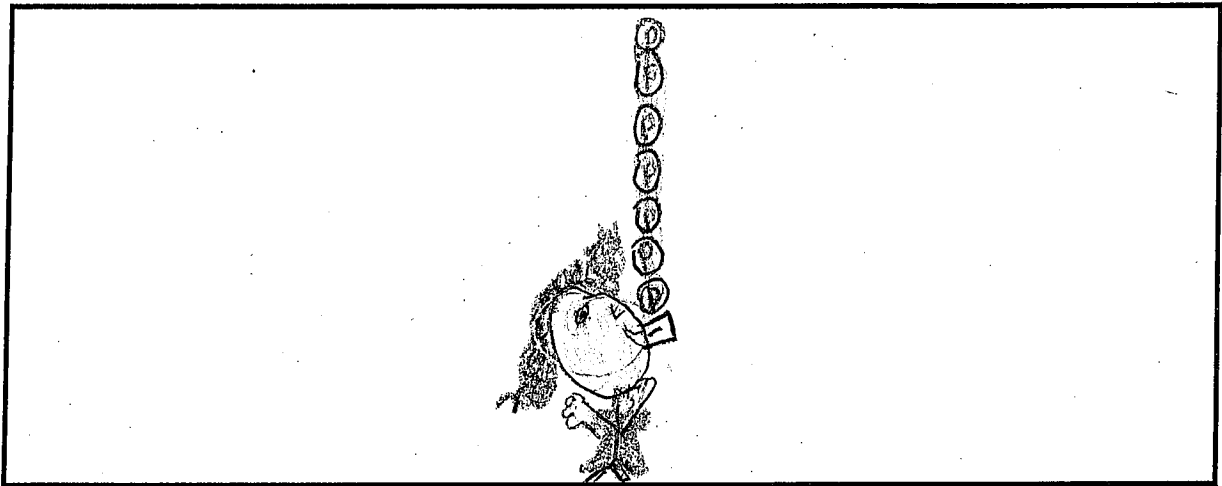
Stand Tall
