UPDATE from the City Manager for Tuesday, March 31, 2020

Governor Sununu's Stay At Home order is in effect, through May 4, 2020.

<u>Stay-At-Home</u> is working! Keep looking out for each other! Our physical-separation efforts seem to be helping, so far. PLEASE continue as we do our part to flatten the curve.

Thank you, Portsmouth! The Portsmouth Fire Department reports that the community was very generous in its donations of PPE and other needed emergency supplies during last week's collection drive. The donated items are invaluable in keeping Portsmouth's First Responders safe as they continue their work in the face of the COVID-19 emergency.

REMINDER: PLEASE tell first responders if anyone in your household is quarantined due to COVID-19 if you need contact with the Fire Department, Police Department or other emergency services. If they are not wearing personal protective equipment when they are exposed, they must self-quarantine for 14 days. No exceptions. That reduces the force available to respond to emergencies.

NEW:

The US Postal Service continues to operate, with some modifications to reduce health risks on both sides of the counter:

- At the Heritage Avenue post office location, residents will notice several adaptations: there are clear shower curtains up as a form of "window" between customers and USPS personnel and there are 6' distances marked in tape to separate those waiting in line.
- Temporary modifications to the customer signature capture procedures: While maintaining a safe, appropriate distance, employees will request the customer's first initial and last name so that the employee can enter the information on the electronic screen.
- For increased safety with mail delivery to homes and businesses, employees will ask the customer to step back a safe distance or close the door so that they may leave the item in the mail receptacle or appropriate location by the customer door.

We echo the USPS when they say, "We are proud of the work USPS employees play in processing, transporting and delivering mail and packages for the American public, which is a vital public service that is a part of this nation's critical infrastructure."

Meals on Wheels: Starting on April 2, 2020 meal delivery is reduced to Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. There will not be meal delivery on Tuesdays or Thursdays. An extra meal will be included on Monday for Tuesday and on Wednesday for Thursday. Additionally, they will continue to deliver extra shelf-stable food and frozen meals, just in case. New customers are still being accepted, so please call 603-431-0561 to complete an application over the phone.

Operation Blessings is still providing a drive-up food pantry at 600a Lafayette Rd. Wed-Fri, 10am to 4pm, for anyone who needs food (some restrictions may apply).

CITY SERVICES & FACILITIES

All municipal buildings and facilities, schools and the Portsmouth Public Library are closed to the public through May 4, 2020 per the Governor's Stay-At-Home order. City services are staffed *Monday through Friday*, according to staggered work schedules to minimize the number of people in the same place at the same time.

- Paying bills while City Hall is closed to the public. Residents are asked to use the City's online services to pay their water bills, taxes, fees, fines; secure permits, etc. Payments can be mailed or dropped in the drop-box in the City Hall parking lot. Call (844) 850-9185 to pay your water/sewer or property tax bills using Interactive Voice Response (IVR). Account number required. (\$1.50 IVR fee, plus any credit card fees if paying by credit card.)
- NH DMV has extended the expiration date for temporary motor vehicle plates and licenses. All temporary plates issued after March 1. 2020 are now valid through April 30, 2020. City residents can renew their registrations online here. State drivers' licenses and ID cards set to expire can be extended by phone for 6 months. Call 603-227-4020 to pay for and complete the extension.
- Along with public utilities (gas, electric, cable, phone, etc.) the City Department of Public Works Water & Sewer Divisions have suspended all disconnect orders and/or late fees. Contact the City directly if you're having difficulty meeting a bill deadline.
- **Fire Department** has suspended scheduled fire protection inspections and the issuing of any burn permits. If you have a Class 1 or 2 permit (backyard, etc.) the permit expiration is extended to June 1, 2020.
- Building Inspections continue by video for unoccupied and exteriors of buildings.
- Planning Department: For information about land use applications and submission deadlines click here.
- City board, commission and committee meetings are in the process of being scheduled remotely. City Council intends to meet virtually on April 6, 2020, as scheduled. Details to come.

SCHOOLS

The 4-day instructional week started yesterday, March 30. Students will be engaged with teachers on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Tomorrow, Wednesday, for teachers, is devoted to online collaborations for support, planning and building consistent expectations for students in this remote environment.

Starting April 8: Enrichment Wednesdays. The Schools' Unified Arts staff is planning enrichment opportunities in the arts, physical education and more, for students at all grade levels. Not required for students, but highly encouraged. Each building will be sending out information on how students can access these opportunities.

School counselors remain available for support to students who are struggling emotionally or in other ways.

Meal distribution: While schools remain physically closed, pickup for breakfast and lunch continues at the Portsmouth High School cafeteria door between 7:30 am and 12 noon, *Monday through Friday*. Meal distribution also takes place as following at the satellite sites:

Unless indicated otherwise, drop-off locations will be at the typical bus stops in these areas.

Do your part to discourage gatherings of people. All school , playgrounds and ballfields are closed to the public at this time.

#WIPESCLOGPIPES! Please dispose of disinfectant wipes in a separate trash bag. Flush only toilet paper or tissues in the toilet (even the wipes marked "flushable" can clog pipes <u>like this</u>). **Pipes from your home are much smaller in diameter than City sewer lines, so clog much more easily.**

Residents should continue to use <u>Click 'n Fix</u> as needed so service requests can be logged and addressed.

The recycling center is open and staffed to allow just a few vehicles at a time for physical-distancing.

- Per the Governor's order, the recycling center will take CHECKS ONLY (no cash) for the regular fees charged for disposal of the following items:
 - o \$ 5 per tire
 - o \$10 per electronic unit
 - \$20 per freon containing unit (i.e. refrigerators, air conditioners)

Trash pickup is on the normal schedule and yard waste pickups have also begun but may be limited by the availability of workers and trucks.

Trees & Greenery invites you to participate in the City's <u>Adopt-A-Spot Program</u> -- a great family project you can do while staying 6 feet part.

PARKING: The Portsmouth City Council voted to enact Free Parking through April 6, 2020. **On-street and public garage parking fees are suspended. Patrons with monthly parking contracts in the garages are receiving e a 75% credit to their accounts for the free-parking period.** Should the Council decide to extend the Free Parking, further adjustments to monthly parking fees will be made at that time.

Unless you are planning to cancel your parking for a reason unrelated to COVID-19, please keep your account active by paying 25% of April fees at the normal April payment deadline. Should the Parking Holiday be extended by order of City Council, further credits will be applied to May billings. Payments can be dropped off at either Garage Office, or in the gray box in front of City Hall.

The city is still enforcing time limits and safety/loading-zone-type parking restrictions. One of the goals is to keep spaces free around restaurants offering takeout services.

PORTSMOUTH HOUSING AUTHORITY

All Portsmouth Housing Authority Senior and Multi-Unit properties are closed to the public. Only essential caregivers, health care workers and people delivering food or medical supplies are authorized to enter, and only when absolutely necessary. These properties include Margeson, Feaster, Woodbury Manor, State Street, Pleasant Street and Betty's Dream Apartments, as well as Atlantic Heights, Connors Cottage and Lafayette School Senior Housing.

RECREATION/PARKS

A reminder that you should not congregate – <u>anywhere</u>. The Governor's Stay At Home order closed all NH Seacoast beaches Physical-distancing is the new norm, for now. Buildings, playgrounds, ball fields, basketball courts and dog parks remain closed. NH State Parks – except for all Seacoast beaches – are open. BUSINESS & EMPLOYEES

REVISED GUIDANCE FOR BUSINESSES FROM GOVERNOR SUNUNU

The order defining "Essential Businesses" has been updated to include the following regarding Other Retail & Curbside Pick Up or Delivery: https://www.governor.nh.gov/news-media/emergency-orders/documents/emergency-order-17-ex-a.pdf

- Retailers who are not otherwise deemed essential on this list may transition to curbside pick up or delivery only for orders taken online, by phone, or by other remote means.
- On-site cash transactions are not permitted.
- Staff necessary to support taking of orders and curbside pick up or delivery may be physically on site, provided that appropriate physical-distancing protocols are observed and facilities are cleaned frequently.
- In all other instances the retailer's facilities must remain closed to the public.

SBA Preferred Lender Program Participants (Feb 2020) -- As of March 30, 2020, SBA reported that they are waiting for direction as to how the new loan programs associated with the CARES Act will be administered, and are also awaiting clarification as to who is eligible. Only the **local lenders who are on this list of participants** in the Preferred Lender Program will be providing these

NH Employment Security (NHES)

- **Filing for unemployment.** You are assigned a day and time to file based on the first letter of your last name. **The unemployment system hotline is 603-271-7700**.
- Payments are made beginning eight days from when the claim is filed. Those filing claims must login again for each week of continued eligibility and file a continued claim.
- If you're Self Employed and have filed for unemployment benefits, ignore the Denial Message you receive. Your unemployment claim requires time to process as a result of your being Self Employed. You will receive a telephone call from NHES to obtain wage information to process and complete your unemployment claim.

The NH Department of Business and Economic Affairs (BEA) has started <u>this page</u> to keep employees and businesses update. It includes links to <u>New Hampshire Employment Security</u> and available services. Individuals will need to file for unemployment each week of temporary unemployment and this can and should be <u>done online here</u> or by calling 603-271-7700.

STAY SAFE!

Don't congregate. Get outside. Enjoy some fresh air. Just keep your distance. Portsmouth's open space parks and trails are open, but ballfields, basketball courts and playgrounds are NOT. The locks on the gates are there for the protection of all. Remember that you might unknowingly bring COVID-19 back into your house, putting everyone at risk.

Remember to wipe down your cellphones when you're sanitizing surfaces. They're in constant use, connecting hands and face.

And advice from a Boston physician:

- Eliminate play dates, even "1 on 1"
- Eliminate small gatherings, including meetings "between a few families."
- Avoid climbing gyms, restaurants, movie theaters, anything in an enclosed area. Many of these places are advertising increased cleaning and hygiene. This is not sufficient! Do not go.
- Cancel planned vacations for the next month and avoiding airline travel.
- Stay at home as much as possible. They also advise working from home if possible and when you do have to go out to buy groceries or medicine "make the trips quick and purposeful."
- Wash your hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after you've been in public places.
