Please look for the signs and be aware that the time limits in those zones is 15 minutes. On-street and public garage parking fees are suspended. Patrons with monthly parking contracts in the garages are receiving credit to their accounts for the entire free-parking period. Adjustments will be made in the May bills for any April payments made to date.

City Health Department Reminds ALL Returning Travelers to Self-Quarantine

Residents with seasonal winter homes who are returning to New Hampshire may not be aware that the state is under a "Stay At Home" order issued by the Governor. Good public health practice **requires all returning travelers to self-quarantine for 14 days.** Several popular winter residence locations, including Florida, adopted their Stay At Home guidelines only very recently, if at all; so it is likely that Portsmouth residents returning from those places have had greater exposure to COVID-19 and may be unwitting sources of community transmission of the disease back home in New Hampshire. **The City Health Officer asks returning travelers to recognize the urgency of this directive and offers the following guidelines for those returning travelers to follow as they self-quarantine:**

- 1. Do not go out in public.**
2. Take your temperature with a thermometer in the morning and at night, and watch for cough or difficulty breathing.
3. Employees: Discuss your work situation with your employer *before* returning to work.
4. Do not take public transportation, taxis, or ride-shares.
5. Do not have any visitors to your house during this time.
6. Tell home health care/necessary in-home services, that you are under self-quarantine.
7. Keep your distance from others (about 6 feet).
8. If you get sick with fever, cough, shortness of breath or gastrointestinal symptoms call your primary care physician.
9. If you need to seek medical care for other reasons, such as dialysis, call ahead to your doctor and tell them about your recent travel.

10. If you have a medical emergency, call 911. BE SURE to tell them your symptoms and that you are being monitored for COVID-19.

REMINDER: PLEASE tell first responders if anyone in your household is quarantined due to COVID-19 if you need contact with the Fire Department, Police Department or other emergency services. If they are not wearing personal protective equipment when they are exposed, they must self-quarantine for 14 days. No exceptions. That reduces the force available to respond to emergencies.

REMINDER: City Health Officer Joins CDC to Advise: Wear Face Masks in Public

City Health Officer Kim McNamara notes that *fabric masks are recommended -- not surgical masks or N95s*, which are critical supplies for our healthcare and First Responders workforce, to keep us all safe. Handmade facemasks, scarves and other items that cover your nose and mouth are a useful measure of protection and should be laundered after use. Be sure to still wash your hands before putting items on and after taking them off. Meals on Wheels: Meal delivery takes place on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. There will not be meal delivery on Tuesdays or Thursdays. An extra meal will be included on Monday for Tuesday and on Wednesday for Thursday. Additionally, they will continue to deliver extra shelf-stable food and frozen meals, just in case. New customers are still being accepted, so please call 603-431-0561 to complete an application over the phone.

COAST Senior Transportation – Although COAST has suspended the regular fixed route services, Senior Transportation, ADA Service, Community Rides, and accessible Ready Rides are still in operation, with the following updates:

- Effective immediately, Portsmouth Senior Transportation riders **are not restricted to the days or hours of the group shopping trips**. Senior Transportation riders can schedule a shopping trip to any of the locations currently served, at any time Senior Transportation is operating (Monday – Friday, 6:00 am to 6:00 pm).
- COAST is also able to schedule pick up at 5:30 am so Senior Transportation riders can take advantage of senior shopping hours.
- COAST is still accepting new customers. This service is a door to door pick up, so people must be registered for COAST to know the address for pick-up.
- COAST offers free medical appointment rides and \$4 roundtrip shopping trips. <https://coastbus.org/pst> People should confirm with their medical providers before making a trip to a medical appointment.

CITY SERVICES & FACILITIES

All municipal buildings and facilities, schools and the Portsmouth Public Library are closed to the public through May 4, 2020 per the Governor's Stay-At-Home order. City services are staffed *Monday through Friday*, according to staggered work schedules to minimize the number of people in the same place at the same time.

- **City Hall services are still open by phone, email and online. - **Paying bills while City Hall is closed to the public.** Residents are asked to use the City's [online services](#) to pay their water bills, taxes, fees, fines; secure permits, etc. Payments can be mailed or dropped in the drop-box in the City Hall parking lot. Call (844) 850-9185 to pay your water/sewer or property tax bills using Interactive Voice Response (IVR). Account number required. (\$1.50 IVR fee, plus any credit card fees if paying by credit card.)
- **NH DMV has extended the expiration date for temporary motor vehicle plates and licenses.** All temporary plates issued after March 1, 2020 are now valid through April 30, 2020. For information about how vehicle registration works in NH, [click here](#). City residents can [renew their registrations online here](#). **State drivers' licenses and ID cards set to expire can be extended by phone for 6 months.** Call 603-227-4020 to pay for and complete the extension.
- **Along with public utilities (gas, electric, cable, phone, etc.) the City Department of Public Works Water & Sewer Divisions have suspended all disconnect orders and/or late fees. Contact the City directly if you're having difficulty meeting a bill deadline.**
- **Fire Department** has suspended scheduled fire protection inspections and the issuing of any burn permits. If you have a Class 1 or 2 permit (backyard, etc.) the permit expiration is extended to June 1, 2020.
- **Building Inspections continue by video for unoccupied and exteriors of buildings.**

- **Portsmouth Public Schools: At-home learning is now on a 4-day instructional week.** Students will be engaged with teachers on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Enrichment Wednesdays for students start April 8, with opportunities in the arts, physical education and more. Wednesdays, for teachers, is devoted to online collaborations for support, planning and building consistent expectations for students in this remote environment. **Meal distribution:** While schools remain physically closed, our breakfast and lunch pick-up and delivery is still in service. Pickup for breakfast and lunch at the Portsmouth High School cafeteria door between 7:30 am and 12 noon, *Monday through Friday*. DPW

- **The City's Regional Water System** continues to operate, monitor and maintain the Portsmouth and Pease Tradeport Water Treatment systems according to normal operating procedures. Our source waters are chlorinated for adequate disinfection, monitored continuously for chlorine residuals and sampled throughout the water system to assure proper treatment continues. Currently, water supply is adequately meeting demand. A comprehensive water supply update will be provided next week.
- **Residents should continue to use [Click 'n Fix](#)** as needed so service requests can be logged and addressed.
- **The recycling center is open** and staffed to allow just a few vehicles at a time for physical-distancing. No cash accepted. Payment for the usual special item disposal fees must be by check.
- **Trash pickup is on the normal schedule and yard waste pickups have also begun** but may be limited by the availability of workers and trucks.

NH Employment Security (NHES)

- **Filing for unemployment.** You are assigned a day and time to file based on the first letter of your last name. **The unemployment system hotline is 603-271-7700.**
- **Payments are made beginning eight days from when the claim is filed.** Those filing claims must login again for each week of continued eligibility and file a continued claim.
- **If you're Self Employed and have filed for unemployment benefits,** ignore the Denial Message you receive. **Your unemployment claim requires time to process as a result of your being Self Employed.** You will receive a telephone call from NHES to obtain wage information to process and complete your unemployment claim.

STAY SAFE!

Don't congregate. Get outside. Enjoy some fresh air. Just keep your distance. Portsmouth's open space parks and trails are open, but ballfields, basketball courts and playgrounds are NOT. The locks on the gates are there for the protection of all. Remember that you might unknowingly bring COVID-19 back into your house, putting everyone at risk.

Remember to wipe down your cellphones when you're sanitizing surfaces. They're in constant use, connecting hands and face.

Continuing precautions:

- Eliminate play dates, even "1 on 1"
- Eliminate small gatherings, including meetings "between a few families."
- Cancel planned vacations for the next month and avoid airline travel.
- Stay at home as much as possible. When you do have to go out to buy groceries or medicine "make the trips quick and purposeful."
- Wash your hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after you've been in public places.
