UPDATE from the City Manager for Wednesday, April 15, 2020


"Where to find answers" edition.

On April 14, Governor Sununu reinforced that his Stay At Home order is in effect, through May 4, 2020. No decision has been made yet on when there might be a gradual reopening.

The City Health Officer reminds everyone to be vigilant.

- 1. DO NOT CONGREGATE!
- 2. Wear cloth face masks in public. Reserve medical grade PPE for healthcare workers and first-responders. Directions for making your own face mask in 45 seconds, here. https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/cloth-face-cover.html
- 3. Self-quarantine for 14 days if you have just returned from a stay outof-state. For more information, click here. https://www.cityofportsmouth.com/sites/default/files/2020-

- 4. Tell first responders if anyone in the household is quarantined for COVID-19, either as a positive, or awaiting results from testing.

Here are some quick links to frequently asked questions:

I no longer have a paycheck coming in. What now?

- File for unemployment **online** [https://www.nhes.nh.gov]/or by calling the hotline at **603-271-7700**. Your application appointment is based on the first letter of your last name. There are still delays in processing, but you should start seeing a check 9 days after filing. You must file weekly to receive weekly benefits.
- The CARES Act supplements your unemployment pay with a \$600 per week benefit.

My business is closed and I'm worried about paying my employees and my other expenses.

- Apply for the Payroll Protection Plan with your bank. If you use the funds you receive for payroll, it becomes
 a grant. Small businesses, independent contractors, freelancers and other individual business owners can

- The PPP program applies to non-profits, too.
- In addition, the NH Community Development Finance Authority [https://nhcdfa.org/covid-19-resources/] and the Business Finance Authority started accepting applications for funding on April 13.
- The Support Seacoast Arts [https://www.portsmouthnh.com/support-seacoast-arts/] group was formed early in the COVID-19 emergency to encourage donations to keep Portsmouth's arts and cultural institutions afloat while they cannot present performances or event.

I'm under self-quarantine at home. What do I do about groceries and medications?

- First, the US Postal Service and other delivery services are working hard to get vital supplies to people's homes. Take advantage of online ordering.
- Local restaurants are also providing takeout service and delivery via GrubHub, DoorDash, TakeoutGuys and similar services. For a list of takeout options, click here.

- Ask a neighbor if they might pick up what you need and leave it on your doorstep. (Neighbors, check on your neighbors!)

- **GATHER, our local food pantry, can help. Pantry** hours are Mon, Tues, Wed: 10 am − 3 pm at 210 West Road #3 in Portsmouth. Thurs: *Closed*. Fri: 9am-1pm at Community Campus, 100 Campus Drive in Portsmouth.
- **Operation Blessings** drive-up food pantry at 600a Lafayette Rd. Wed-Fri, 10am to 4pm, for Portsmouth residents only. For more information, please call 603-430-8561. **Senior mobile food pantry** to the residents of the Portsmouth area, ages 62 and up, Mon-Sat 10am-4pm. Anyone who is interested please contact Tammy Joslyn at 603-988-2671
- **Meals on Wheels** makes deliveries to Portsmouth seniors on Monday, Wednesday and Friday with the extra meals for Tuesday and Thursday included in the delivery. Additionally, they will continue to deliver extra shelf-stable food and frozen meals, just in case. New customers are still being accepted, so please call 603-431-0561 to complete an application over the phone.
- The Portsmouth School Department provides daily lunches, Monday though Friday, to schoolchildren.
