The Governor's "Stay At Home" order remains in effect through May 4, 2020. He announced the formation of an Economic Reopening Task Force comprised of a broad spectrum of NH businesses and organizations. At his press conference today, he suggested that openings in some counties may lag other parts of the state due to health cautions. He is expected to update his guidance at the end of this week.

- **GOSLING ROAD: Started Tuesday, April 28.** Between the Spaulding Turnpike on/off-ramps and Market Street. Portsmouth and Newington will complete a shared repaving project, one lane at a time, while traffic is light over the next couple of weeks. Flaggers and police details will be on station to direct traffic, as needed.
- **MARKET STREET & KEARSARGE WAY BRIDGES:** Prep work and signage installation start this week. Kearsarge Way Bridge will be reduced to one lane, with alternating traffic directed by temporary traffic signals. Market Street between the Sarah Long Bridge and the Noble's Island traffic signal will be reduced to one lane in each direction. For more information, click here.

- **CITY HALL PARKING LOT AND DRIVEWAY REPAVING starts Thursday.**
- **BARTLETT/ISLINGTON STREETS: Construction work started today on the Bartlett intersection.** The detour for the season starts Thursday for one-way, inbound/easterly traffic between the bridge over the Bypass to Aldrich Road and outbound/westerly traffic, detoured down Aldrich.
- **BOW STREET REPAVING:** Daniel Street to Chapel Street will be closed to through-traffic and no parking will be allowed in that section. A flagger will be in place to direct traffic around the Penhallow Street detour. The rest of Bow St. is unaffected.
- **MAPLEWOOD AVE** work has resumed for the season.
- **PRESCOTT PARK DOCK RAILING replacement work continues.** The dock remains closed.
