

Project Timeline

- CMAQ Grant Application 2010
- CMAQ Grant Approval 2012
- Complete Streets, Pedestrians and Bike Plan 2013-2014
- Advertised for Design Services 2014
- CMAQ Funding Sequestered, Project on Hold 2014-2015
- McFarland Johnson Selected as Consultant 2015
- Scope and Fee Revised to Include Additional Roadway Improvements, Bike Facility – 2015
- Revised Scope and Fee Approved 2016
- Project Funding (\$2.7M State \$1.8M City)(60%/40%)



Public Information Meeting - June 2, 2016

- What we heard from the public
 - Need sidewalks (not necessarily both sides)
 - Crosswalks
 - Need bike accommodations (bike lane or shared lane)
 - Mixing bicycles and cars not a good idea
 - Combining pedestrians and bicycles on shared use path (preferably on south side of road)
 - Curbing/Drainage upgrades along entire roadway
 - High speed of all traffic
 - Truck Traffic (speeds and noise)
 - Use City owned land for pocket parks
 - Move mailboxes to improve access and safety
 - How will my property be impacted?





Project Purpose

The project's purpose is to reconstruct Peverly
Hill Road from Middle Road to West Road in
order to provide a safer roadway for all users in
conformance with the City of Portsmouth's
Complete Street Policy.





Project Need

- Vehicles currently travel at high rates of speed along the roadway
- There are some sight distance restrictions that contribute to safety issues
- Lack of bicycle or pedestrian accommodations
- Mix of residential and commercial traffic
- Drainage issues exist along the roadway












OPTION 1 - SHARED USE SIDE PATH ON SOUTH SIDE NOT TO SCALE






OPTION 2 - SHARED USE SIDE PATH ON SOUTH SIDE AND SIDEWALK ON NORTH SIDE

NOT TO SCALE






OPTION 3 - SIDEWALK ON NORTH SIDE AND BIKE LANES
NOT TO SCALE




Alternatives Workshop Meeting - July 27, 2016

- What we heard from the public
 - Like bicycles accommodated off the roadway
 - Like narrower roadway to help reduce speeds
 - Like sidewalks/path on both sides of roadway
 - Pedestrians can use sidewalk and crosswalks to gain access to either side of roadway
 - Concerned about Right-of-Way impacts
 - Concerned about disruption to traffic and residents during construction








- What we heard from the public

 - Continued concerns with impacts to property along roadway
































































Public Need and Right-of-Way

- Project Requires City to Acquire Minor, but Critical Easements
- Federal Funds and Conservation Land Impacts Require a
 Public Necessity Hearing and other Process
- Need Resident Input as to Public Interest and Need for this
 Project





Next Steps

- Public Submits Comments and Concerns by February 26, 2021
- City Decides How to Proceed with Project
- Submit Plans and Environmental Review to NHDOT
- R.O.W. Process Begins
- Complete Final Design
- Anticipated Construction 2023
