

NOW AVAILABLE! PUBLIC ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT — The City's award-winning Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (AFCR) and Popular Annual Financial Report (PAFR) for the Fiscal Year-ended June 30, 2022 (FY22) are now available on the City of Portsmouth website and the PAFR, in print. Prepared under the guidance of Director of Finance and Administration Judie Belanger, the ACFR is the City's official, audited full financial disclosure, reporting on the financial health of the City. It consists of three sections: Introductory, Financial and Statistical. The **Introductory** section guides the reader through the report.

The **Financial** section presents the basic financial statements and the independent auditors' report. The **Statistical** section provides financial trends over a ten-year period. The PAFR extracts and summarizes financial information from the ACFR and is presented in a more visual, interactive and easy-to-read format for readers with various levels of financial knowledge. 
