 - <u>Prescott Park, State St Parking Lot</u>: City request, poor health, maple, removal suggested by city. Tree is in poor health, many dead branches at the top of the tree, and basal damage present.
 - <u>South Mill Parking Lot</u>: City request, poor health, linden, removal suggested by city. Tree has clear issues including decay and structural inadequacies. When considering the use area it is appropriate for removal.
 - <u>182 Colonial Dr</u>: City request, fair health, linden, removal suggested by city. Tree was subject to significant storm damage and utility clearance pruning.
 - <u>170 Colonial Dr</u>: City request, fair health, linden, removal suggested by city. Tree was subject to utility clearance pruning, and what remains is growing down toward the ground.
