- South Mill Playground: 1 red oak, fair condition. The tree suffered a large limb failure in spring 2020 and has had difficulty compartmentalizing the wound. There is a large cavity present.
- Hall Cemetery: 2 Norway maple, removal recommended by City. These two trees were not identified in the initial posting for the cemetery project. These removals will allow for better access.
- Portsmouth Senior Activity Center: $10+$ ash, EAB related, removal recommended by City. There are many ash trees lining the parking lot of the Senior Activity Center in various stages of decline from EAB. (Look for a yellow barricade with the removal notice, then look above the fence.)
- 235 Union St: 1 ash, EAB related, removal recommended by City. (There are new sewer pieces on the road in front of this tree.)
- 209 Lafayette Rd: 1 Norway maple, poor condition, removal recommended by City.
- $\mathbf{5 9 9}$ Middle St: 1 ash, EAB related, removal recommended by City.
- 729 Middle St: 1 Norway maple, poor condition, removal recommended by City.
- 761 South St: 1 Norway maple, poor condition, removal recommended by City.
- 560 Lincoln Ave: 1 ash, EAB related, removal recommended by City.
- 377 Thornton St: 3 ash, EAB related, removal recommended by City.
- Hanover Garage near High St: 4 yew, poor-fair condition, removal recommended by City. Construction has prompted these removal requests.
- Pleasant St + Porter St: 1 linden, poor condition, removal recommended by City. The tree has been in a state of decline, and a recent limb failure has prompted this removal request.
- Near 673 Woodbury Ave: 1 ash, EAB related, removal recommended by City.
- Near 865 Woodbury Ave: 1 ash, EAB related, recommended by City.
- $\mathbf{8 8 0}$ Woodbury Ave: 1 Norway maple, poor condition, removal recommended by City. The tree has trunk and basal wounds and a declining canopy.
- Community Campus near the greenhouse and playground: 4 hemlock, poor-fair condition, removal recommended by City. These trees are in a state of decline and have been impacting the ventilation units nearby.
